

Prevention: Preventing a housed person from becoming homeless. Diversion: A strategy that diverts people from entering the homeless system, such as helping them identify immediate alternative arrangements.	Individuals/Families are connected to emergency shelter, coordinated entry, and other appropriate services through mobile street outreach teams, events, SafePlace sites, and resource/drop-in centers.	Individuals/families complete an assessment at a Coordinated Entry Site to be matched to an appropriate housing program among all homeless service agencies in the system, based on their need and vulnerability.	Designated space to sleep that provides safe, secure, violent-free place for persons and families who would otherwise be living on the streets.	Provide immediate temporary housing and services for individuals and families eligible for housing programs.	Temporary housing with supportive services to facilitate a household's successful movement to permanent housing.	Provides short-or medium-term rental assistance and targeted supportive services to help individuals/families achieve and maintain housing stability as quickly as possible.	Pairs a housing subsidy with intensive case management and robust supportive services.

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
